Expression of support for the Tax Justice Network Australia submission to the PRRT Inquiry from Publish What You Pay Australia

Publish What You Pay (PWYP) Australia writes in support of the submission the Tax Justice Network Australia (TJN-A) has submitted to Treasury on the review of the Petroleum Resource Rent Tax (PRRT).

PWYP Australia is a coalition of humanitarian, faith-based, environmental, anti-corruption, research and union organisations campaigning for greater transparency and accountability in the extractive industries. PWYP Australia works with the global Publish What You Pay coalition, a network of over 800 member organisations in more than 60 countries around the world, united in their call for an open and accountable extractive sector, so that oil, gas and mining revenues improve the lives of women, men and youth in resource-rich countries.

PWYP Australia believes that the opaque nature of the extractives sector in Australia is contributing to the difficulty of ensuring that the Australian public is getting a good deal from the extraction of its natural resources. PWYP Australia is active in working towards improving transparency of the extractives sector in Australia and welcomes the measures already made by the Commonwealth, which includes the implementation of the Extractives Industries Transparency Initiate (EITI) as well as the natural resource commitments made within Australia's first National Action Plan (NAP) for the Open Government Partnership (OGP). However, these international mechanisms will not result in significant change to the sector, or increased benefit to the Australian public, if they are not supported by robust domestic fiscal policies.

It is for this reason that PWYP Australia sees the PRRT review as a valuable and timely process. The TJN-A submission, and the Governments discussion paper both highlight that the PRRT is failing to ensure that the revenues of Australia's finite gas resources are being sufficiently captured.



PWYP Australia supports the TJN-A recommendation of a new Commonwealth Offshore royalty on all current and future offshore oil and gas projects that are currently only subject to the PRRT. We think this is a reasonable measure that ensures Australia captures the benefits of its natural resources and that these are distributed to the Australian community.
