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We wanted to provide you with a short update on the Review of the Exploration Development Incentive (EDI) scheme.

By way of background, the Exploration Development Incentive (EDI) allows small mineral exploration companies with no taxable income to provide exploration credits, paid as a refundable tax offset, to their Australian resident shareholders for new mineral exploration. The EDI is due to expire at the end of the 2016-17 financial year and the Explanatory Memorandum to the legislation included an undertaking for a Review.

The Department of Industry, Innovation and Science (DIIS) is leading the Review and have engaged consultants to prepare a Report. To oversee the Review, DIIS has established an interdepartmental committee which includes Treasury, the Australian Taxation Office, Prime Minister & Cabinet and the Department of Finance.
