Thanks for the response. Could I at least ask you to clarify if Flavel is still a Treasury employee?

While I understand there are sensitivities around the case, the material you've already provided on the public record establishes that Flavel is no longer working in the capacity of dep sec so I think it's reasonable to expect a federal department to explain why. No publicly-listed company could just announce the departure of a senior executive employee without revealing - even when asked - why that person is no longer in their job. I'd like to think that the APS is committed to transparency and could *at least* say whether that senior executive is still an employee? I know you will be motivated by the best of reasons - including fairness to Mr Flavel. But as it stands I can write an article saying "Treasury dep sec gone, department won't rule out misconduct investigation" and the inference that there is a misconduct investigation is still there.

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
