Submission – Incentivising relevant charities to join the National Redress Scheme for Child Sexual Abuse – New ACNC Governance Standard

The Australian Council of Social Service (ACOSS) is a national voice in support of people affected by poverty, disadvantage and inequality and the peak body for the community services and civil society sector. ACOSS consists of a network of approximately 4000 organisations and individuals across Australia in metro, regional and remote areas. Our vision is an end to poverty in all its forms; economies that are fair, sustainable and resilient; and communities that are just, peaceful and inclusive.

ACOSS welcomes the opportunity to contribute to this process, noting our strong support for the National Redress Scheme. The Scheme plays a crucial role providing a measure of justice for survivors of institutional child sex abuse and accountability for institutions that perpetrated abuse.

ACOSS supports the proposal to introduce a governance standard that would require a registered entity to take reasonable steps to become a participating non-government institution if the entity is, or is likely to be, identified as being involved in the abuse of a person either in an application for redress made under section 19 of the National Redress Scheme for Institutional Child Sexual Abuse Act 2018; or in information given in response to a request under section 24 or 25 of that Act. We acknowledge that charities that have or are likely to have a claim made against them will be required to take reasonable steps towards joining the Redress Scheme to meet the governance standard.
