Thank you for the opportunity to participate in the Modernising Registry Fees consultation process.

ASIC registry data is used by ABS to understand business structures. This supports ABS in collecting, compiling, and linking data to produce statistics. There is scope for ABS to further leverage ASIC registry information for these purposes via the MBR program.

ABS also view information held by ASIC as a data asset that could be used across government to support policy development and analysis, efficient processes (eg. collect once), and to reduce burden on business.

To support these whole of government purposes, ABS advocate for government agencies to be able to access ASIC registry data at no cost where they have an approved purpose.
