

- Engaging with states and territories and industry through the longstanding National Oil Supplies Emergency Committee (NOSEC), with NOSEC to provide advice on activation of the advice on the activation of the National Liquid Fuel Emergency Response Plan and the Liquid Fuel Emergency Act 1984 should conditions deteriorate.
  - : The Energy Minister, after consulting states and territories, can declare a liquid fuel emergency if satisfied that it is necessary in the public interest to do so by reason that there is a shortage, or the likelihood of a shortage, of liquid fuel, being a shortage of a magnitude warranting action under the Act.
  - : Directions could include fuel rationing (that is, a restriction on the amount of fuel users can purchase) and/or a direction that suppliers make available certain volumes for sale to particular defined users.
  - : Considering whether to call for voluntary demand management ahead of any formal directions being issued.
